Headline: Shall We Dance?

Dixie Chopper Business Center and the Airport Bistro Bar will host two ballroom dances in September that are open to the public. The dances will be held on Sunday, September 20th and Sunday, September 27th, from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM. On both days, there will be a one hour dance lesson for beginners, starting at 5:00 PM, followed by two hours of open dance featuring many different types of dance music. Admission is \$10.00 per person; students (presenting student ID) and Senior Citizens, aged 65 and older will receive a discounted admission price of \$5.00 per person.

Dance organizers, Tim and Viki Tillotson, state that Dixie Chopper is donating the space for the dances. They hope attendance will indicate that there are enough people interested in dancing to support a local non-profit dance club whose purpose will be to provide affordable lessons and dance opportunities for the community. “We drive all the way to downtown Indianapolis to dance,” said Tim. “It would be really nice to have some place to go nearby.”

If there is enough interest to start a club, the Tillotsons state the admission fees will be used to promote the club as well as cover the future costs of renting a dance hall, a DJ and a dance instructor. The Club will offer lessons in many different styles of dance, such as fox trot, swing, waltz, rumba, etc., and provide opportunities for dancing to all kinds of music on a regular basis.

If there is not enough interest to start a club, the admission fees will be donated to two charities: 50% to the Humane Society and 50% to the Putnam County Non-Food Pantry at St. Andrews Episcopal Church. For additional information, contact Tim Tillotson at 765.522.3251.
