

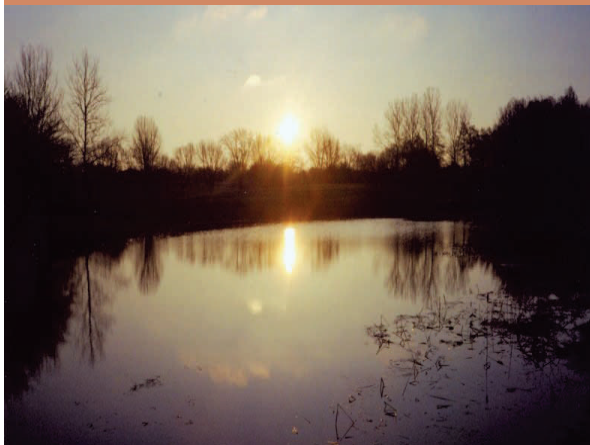
GIFTS UNDER A WILL

DO I REALLY NEED A WILL?

Preparing a will is one important way of expressing concern for others. Those who have made preparations are glad they've taken care of things and eased the burden on their heirs and families.

- Do you have children, a spouse or a friend you are caring for?
- Do you have possessions or other property—real estate or personal property?
- Do you wish to keep control of your estate in your hands or those of your heirs, instead of the government?
- Do you wish to mitigate fighting and disagreements between heirs over your possessions?
- Would you like to keep your property from being unnecessarily diminished by professional fees, taxes, and probate costs?

If you answer “yes” to any of the above questions, you do need a will.

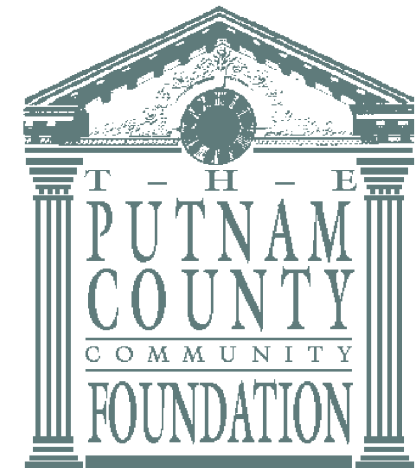

BEQUEST LANGUAGE

The following information is provided to assist individuals and their attorneys to make gifts to the Community Foundation through a will. Each individual situation is unique and, therefore, the following examples are only a few of the possible scenarios. We encourage you to share your ideas and philanthropic dreams with the Community Foundation to ensure your wishes can be properly followed and recognized. **Note:** Those who name the Community Foundation in their estate plans are eligible to join our *Legacy Society*.

STEP ONE: Decide which type of bequest fulfills your wishes. There are four popular types of bequests:

I. Percentage of estate: "I give, devise, and bequeath to Putnam County Community Foundation, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Indiana, located in Greencastle, IN 46135, ____% of my estate."

II. Residual from estate: "I give, devise, and bequeath to Putnam County Community Foundation, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Indiana, located in Greencastle, IN 46135, all the residue of my estate, including real and personal property."

III. Contingent estate gift: "In the event of the prior death of any of the beneficiaries, I give, devise and bequeath to Putnam County Community Foundation, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Indiana, located in Greencastle, IN 46135, (*include percentage, specific, or residual language as described*).

IV. Specific estate gift: "I give, devise, and bequeath to Putnam County Community Foundation, a nonprofit corporation of the State of Indiana, located in Greencastle, IN 46135:

(*Choose one of the following options*):

- a) The sum of \$ _____."
- b) _____ shares of stock in _____ Company,"
- c) my real property commonly known as _____ legal address _____." *Include a description of the property, including its exact location.*

STEP TWO: Decide how you wish the bequest assets to be utilized. *The flexibility of the Community Foundation allows nearly unlimited giving options.*

Add to Existing Fund(s) at the Community Foundation. "This devise will be used to be added to and administered as a part of the (Name of Fund), upon the terms and conditions of that Fund, and in accordance with the governing instruments of The Putnam County Community Foundation, as amended from time to time."

If you are planning early, we urge you to consider establishing a **Donor-Advised Fund** with the Putnam County Community Foundation and then **designate that fund** in your will. A Donor-Advised Fund allows donors to make changes regarding the intended beneficiaries of their estate until their deaths **without** the expense and hassle of modifying a will. To pursue this option, contact the Community Foundation office.

Establish a Named Fund Within An Existing Endowment: "This devise shall be used to establish a component fund of the (Name of Existing Fund) to be known as the (Name of Fund). This devise will be added to and administered as a part of the (Name of Existing Fund), upon the terms and conditions of that fund, and in accordance with the governing instruments of The Putnam County Community Foundation, as amended from time to time."

Establish a Field-of-Interest Endowment: "This devise will be used to establish a component fund to be known as the (Name of Fund). Per the payout and spending policies of the Community Foundation, distributions from the Fund will be utilized for (*specify the charitable purpose of the Fund; for example, 'the environment,' 'care of the homeless,' 'senior citizen health care.'* etc.)."

Establish an Agency Endowment Fund: "This devise will be used to establish a component fund to be known as the (Name of Fund). Per the payout and spending policies of the Community Foundation, distributions from the Fund will be utilized for (*insert name of particular charitable agency to be supported; for example, The ABC Church, the ABC Community Hospital, or the ABC School District*)."
